Friday, October 13 (12- 1PM), SST 318: NSF Graduate Research Fellowship Program (GRFP). This is an extremely prestigious fellowship provides over \$100,000 of support over 3 years. Many UCI Social Sciences students from several of our departments have received this award. Candidates must be a US citizen or permanent resident, in the first two years of the graduate program, and not have received a master's degree within the past two years. A student panel of previous recipients of this award will share their advice for preparing your proposal.

Friday, October 20 (12 - 1PM), SST 318: Ford Foundation Fellowship. This fellowship program seeks to increase faculty diversity and targets individuals committed to a career in teaching and research at the college or university level. The program awards predoctoral (\$24,000/year for 3 years), dissertation (\$25,000 for one year), and postdoctoral fellowships (\$45,000 for one year). Must be US citizen or permanent resident. A student panel of previous recipients and/or honorable mentions of this award will share their advice for preparing your proposal.
